One of the things we have been practicing is making predictions before and during the reading of a book. A common prediction is whether or not the book will be a fiction story or a nonfiction, informative book. They are also asked to tell why they made their prediction. For example, was it based on a picture or words in the title or on a page?

This week we learned all about deciduous trees and their leaves. Our informative writing pieces were about deciduous trees and we learned how they use the air and soil to make food for their leaves. We learned a basic understanding of photosynthesis and why they change colors in the Fall. Be sure to have your child tell you the story using the green overlay.
